PRACTICAL APPLICATION | Walking It Out

Key Thought: *Legacy is not just about what we leave behind, but what we invest in today that will outlive us.*

1. What could your spiritual legacy look like?
 2. In what ways are you investing in eternity right now (time, talent, treasure)?
 3. What would it look like for you to become more intentional about leaving a legacy that matters in God's Kingdom?
 4. Are there any changes you feel prompted to make in your giving, serving, or relationships?
 5. How can your small group work together to make an impact beyond just this season?
 6. Take a Step: Write out a personal legacy statement this week (one sentence).
Example: "I want to be remembered as someone who loved people deeply and gave generously to advance God's Kingdom."
- Then take one step toward living it—whether it's through giving, serving, encouraging, or mentoring.

OPENING DISCUSSION | Let's Get the Discussion Started

Read Matthew 6:19–21 (NIV)

“Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and vermin destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moths and vermin do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.”

Read Psalm 112:1–9 (NLT)

“Praise the Lord! How joyful are those who fear the Lord and delight in obeying his commands...They share freely and give generously to those in need. Their good deeds will be remembered forever.”

BIBLICAL REFLECTION | What Does God Say About This?

1. What are the key contrasts Jesus makes in Matthew 6:19–21? What do you think is the difference between treasures on earth and treasures in heaven?

2. How does this teaching from Jesus in Matthew 6 challenge the way our culture views success, wealth, and legacy?

3. Psalm 112 describes the life of someone who fears God and lives generously. What qualities or actions stand out to you in this passage?

4. Psalm 112: 9 says, “Their good deeds will be remembered forever.” What kind of deeds or lifestyle do you think this verse is talking about?

5. When you think about your own life—what “treasures” are you currently storing?

Where would you say your heart is, based on how you spend your time, energy, and money?
